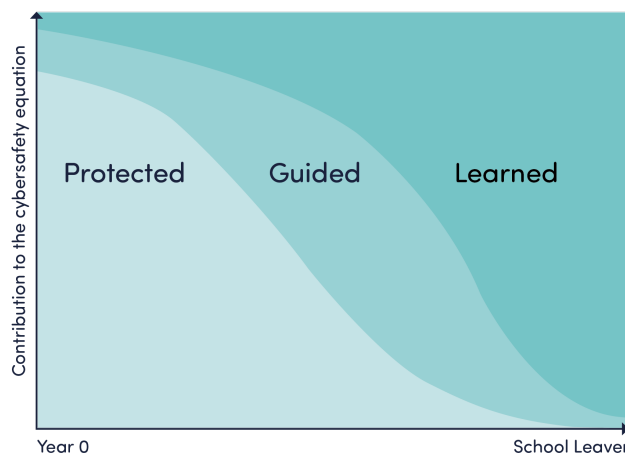


Cyber-safety and Digital Citizenship Glamorgan School Overview

The **Learn Guide Protect** (LGP) framework recognises that striking the right balance of promotion and protection activities and strategies requires schools to consider factors such as students' ages, teacher capability and levels of community engagement. Netsafe's Learn Guide Protect framework draws from this idea.

It is organised into three themes:

- 1. Learn:** Students develop the competencies and values to keep themselves and others safe online — promote; and
- 2. Guide:** The programmes, practice and resources put in place to support student learning and develop a culture of positive digital technology at school and in the wider community — promote; and
- 3. Protect:** Technical methods to restrict or monitor online access and school developed policies that underpin a safe and secure digital learning environment.



The diagram shows the changing emphasis of the three components of the framework as students progress through school.
